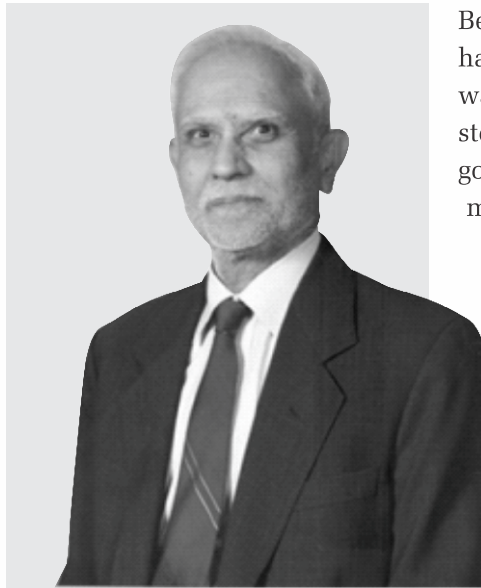
MY EMERALD STORY

Part 1

Dr. Rajnikant Shah is a one man army. He is an amalgamation of a doctor, a jeweller, a devotee, a philanthropist, but most importantly an expanding visionary who believes that the worst kind of poverty is the poverty of vision. Dr. Shah shares his life experiences and lessons learnt at various junctures in his carrier across continents. Gem World brings to you his life stories penned by him in a four-part series. The first part is his New York connection.

NEW YORK Story

I had no experience in gemstone trading. I was just trying to finish my M.D. in medicine but destiny had other plans for me. This emerald story is partly written in New York and partly in Jaipur. My story starts in 1965, when I came to New York to study medicine. At that time, New York had world's fair running. I selected a nearby hospital so that I could visit the jewellery fair and checked that it was convenient to go to the



Jewellery Market – The Diamond District; which is located on 47th street in Manhattan. My hospital was located in Flushing, so it was convenient to commute.

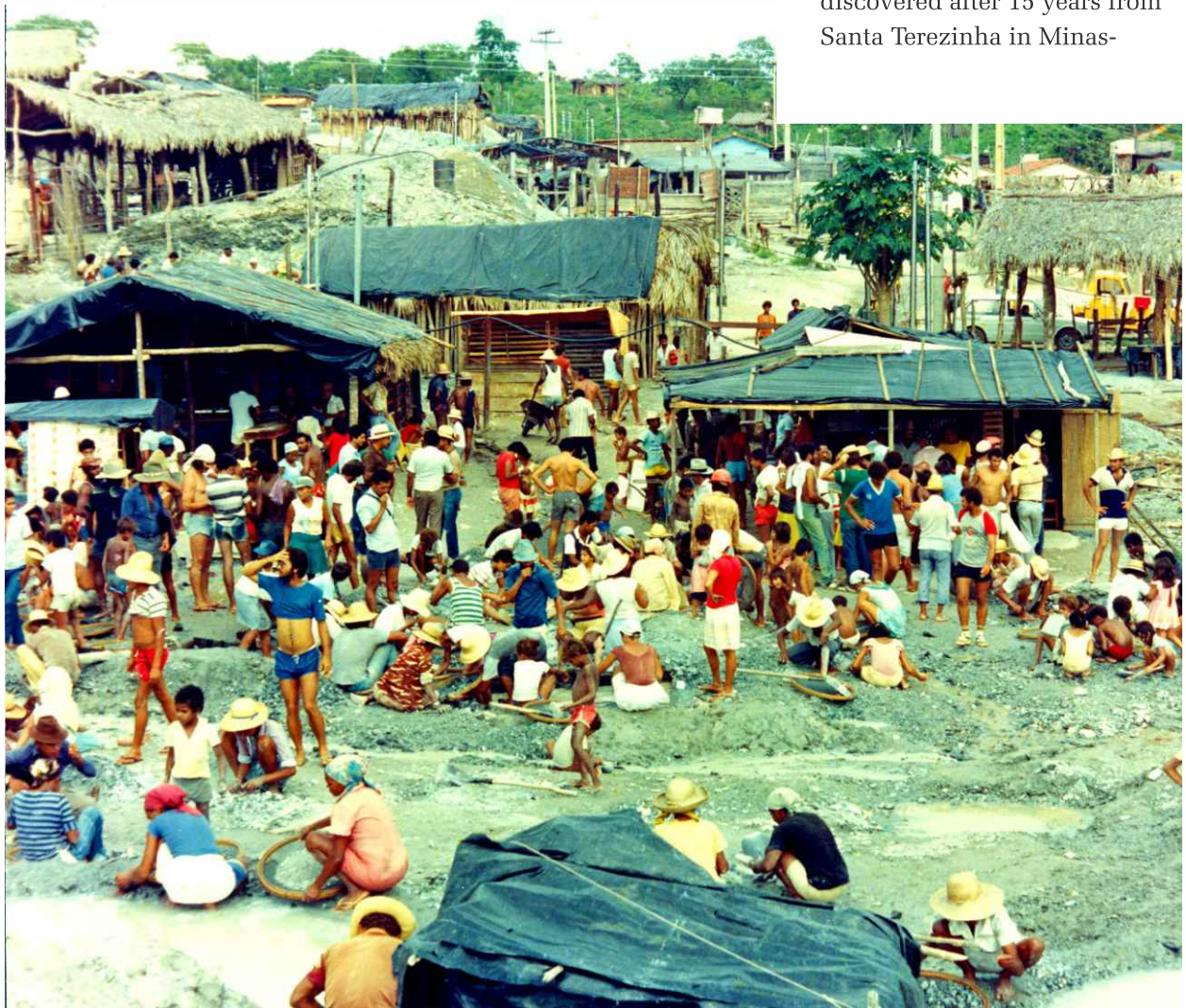
Before coming to New York, I had spoken to my uncle who was a dealer in semi-precious stones to supply the goods if I got some orders from the market. Similarly, I had a talk with my friends who were dealing in emeralds, to supply cut and polish goods on consignment basis which I tried to sell, otherwise I returned the same. Those days, consignment shipments were common. This way, it allowed the buyers to check the quality of the goods and then purchase. Whenever I was off duty from the hospital, I went to 47th street to meet traders. In my weekly visits, I showed

gemstones that I carried to take orders. I then forwarded those orders to my uncle's company, Shantilal & Co., who in turn shipped the goods in a few days. My friends sent consignments of emeralds which I gave to the traders and told them to use whatever they needed. I used to offer the remainder consignment to another buyer and leave it with them for a week. I then connected with other buyers who selected and purchased from the lots. This way the parcel was sold in a couple of months. Traders were ready to pay right away but I did not collect the

money until I was ready to send payments to India. I collected the cheques and deposited in the bank, and sent the payment to India for the goods sold. Most of the goods were sold – priced as per invoice – final, no bargain. Sometimes, nothing from the shipment was sold and I had to return the balance shipment back to the source. A broker - clearing agent from the airport visited to deliver and pick up the shipments. So, I had no problem with shipping and banking or payments from the traders. This helped me to gain insight into the industry.

BRAZIL
Story I
Rough Emerald:

In the following year, I met Shiv Shankar Ji Gupta in New York, who paid a courtesy call in the hospital. He was involved in buying rough emeralds from Brazil which was from Salininha mines in Carnaiba near Campo Formoso which was called as old Brazil. This rough was available in commercial quantities. In comparison, new Brazil was discovered after 15 years from Santa Terezinha in Minas-



Gerais. The quality wasn't satisfactory. It had a bluish and smoky tinge, but the size was good. It had many cracks, and needed oiling all the time. He had monopoly in the beginning when he used to purchase large quantities and supply to Jaipur market. This led to the growth of Emeralds in Jaipur's market. Unfortunately, he lost his brother in Brazil in 1974 and after that tragedy, his purchasing cooled off. As time went by, other buyers started travelling to Brazil to purchase rough and sell in Jaipur. As competition increased, prices started going up. The first time I went to Brazil was in 1974 with my cousin.

JAIPUR Story I

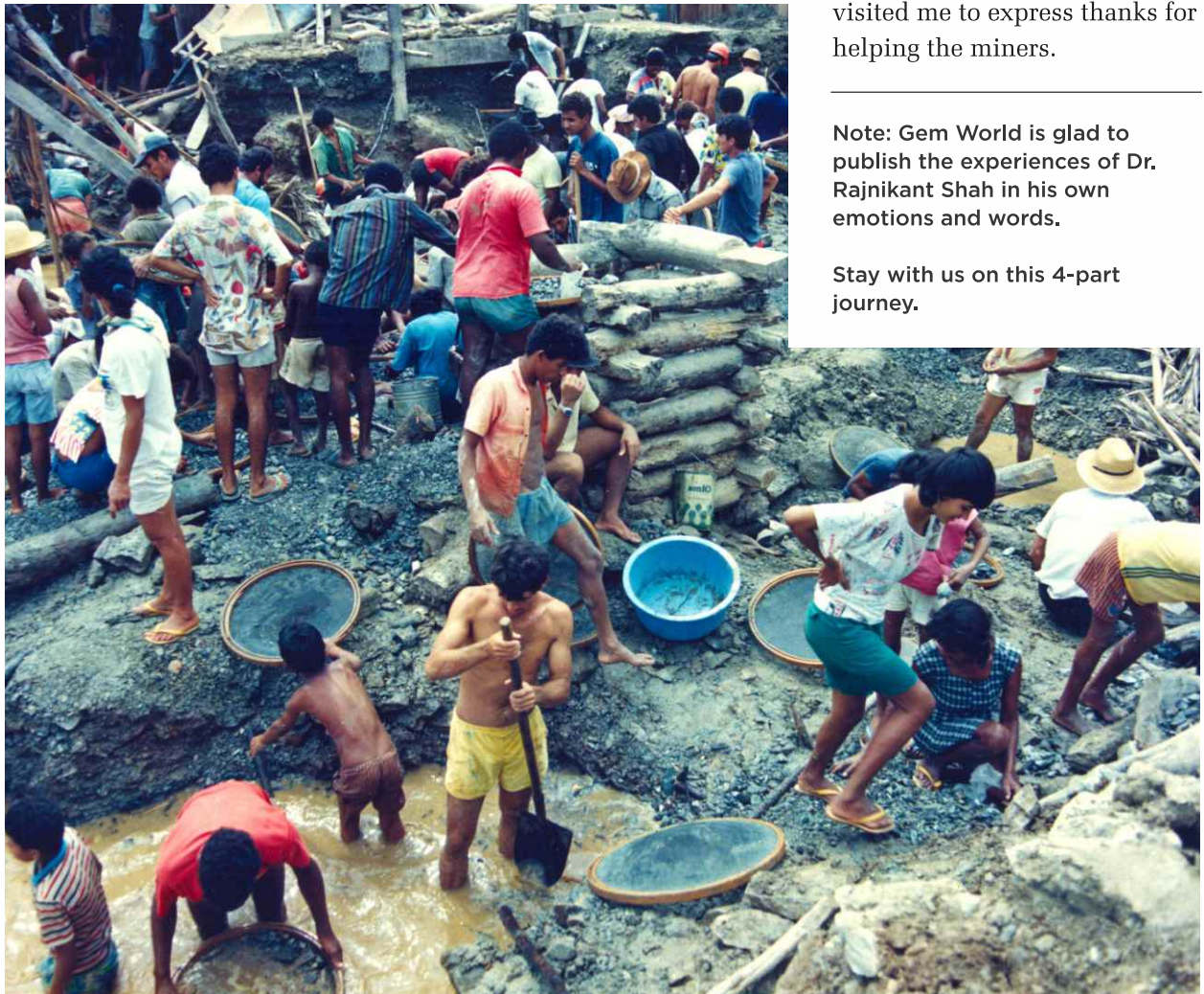
My Jaipur story starts in 1976 when the emerald market in Jaipur tumbled and prices went down. There was a popular saying during those times that 'prices written on paper – Dharawat List – which was 10% of the original price, when sold will be 10 times more. But due to the market conditions, traders were willing to discount goods anywhere up to 80%. Demands for the goods were not satisfactory. Another issue was the size of the stones.

Foreign market needed calibrated goods, while Jaipur craftsmen were used to free cutting. They would try to cut thick stones to preserve carat weight and earn higher revenue. Goods were sold by weight and not by size. We will discuss how calibration was introduced in Jaipur as we move on in the story.

For next couple of years, no Indians went to purchase rough emeralds. Miners started moving out of area to do farming or driving trucks, etc. I was the only one who went regularly and bought rough. I tried to buy from each and every miner to help them. Even the mayor of Campo once visited me to express thanks for helping the miners.

and Earrings. Morelle Davidson is a fine jewellery company specialising in antique and vintage jewellery, signed pieces, and coloured gemstones.

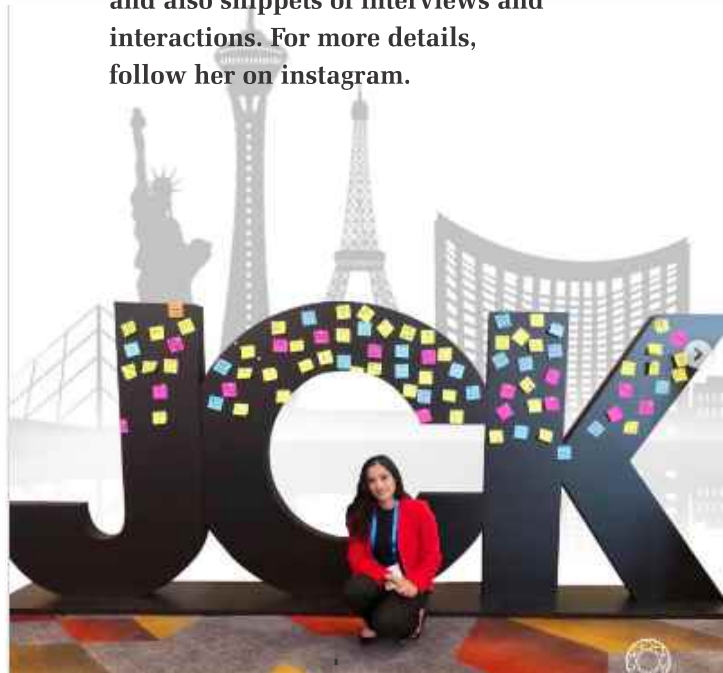
Vhernier

Q. Please tell us about your company and the role you play in it?

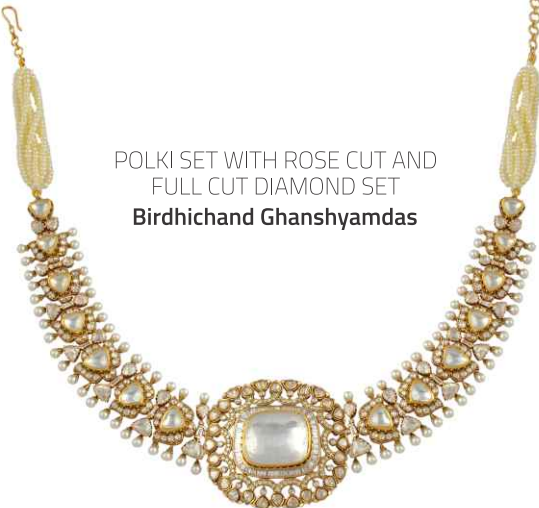

HACKMANITE

An Unusual Rare Gem

Hackmanite is a rare sulphur-rich variety of sodalite exhibiting an unusual and special optical property, known as 'tenebrescence' or 'reversible photochromism'. This feature allows the gemstone or mineral to change its colour temporarily when exposed to different types of light or energy; Hackmanite when mined appears pink to purple, but on exposure to sunlight it turns to greyish or pale colours. These pale colours, when kept in dark for several hours or exposed to ultraviolet light, attain their original colours. This process can be repeated for unlimited times. The reversible photochromism property makes Hackmanite a rare and prized mineral for collectors. However, there has been a sudden surge in supply of Hackmanite in Jaipur market in past few months, as evident from the frequency of submissions for certification at the IIGJ-Research & Laboratories Centre (formerly, GJEPC-Gem Testing Laboratory).

APPEARANCE

Hackmanite ranges in colours from pale blue, grey, pink to violet, which after exposure to ultraviolet light for few seconds, changes to deeper shades of purple and violet. These colours fade back to their original colours after exposure to strong light for few minutes. While transparent hackmanite is extremely rare and is found only in small sizes, most of the Hackmanites seen at the IIGJ-Research & Laboratories Centre were translucent (cloudy) to opaque – cabochon and bead grades. However, these grades were seen in appreciable sizes of up to ~10ct for polished specimens; rough specimens were even bigger weighing several grams up to ~50 grams.

Hackmanite is a complex sodium aluminium silicate mineral of the sodalite group with substitution of chlorine and sulphur ions, where sulphur ions are responsible for the 'tenebrescence' effect. As a result, some Hackmanites which do not exhibit observable tenebrescence qualify only as sodalite – a blue translucent gemstone well-known in the trade.

Perfect crystals of Hackmanite are extremely rare; most rough Hackmanite is found in massive form i.e., without any specific shape. Finding pure Hackmanite is also rare and is commonly associated with other minerals such as calcite, sodalite, feldspar, richterite, lazurite, diopside, afghanite, etc. As a result, it is not uncommon to find different minerals in the same specimen at the time of testing.

PROPERTIES

Another striking property of hackmanite is the orange to yellow fluorescence under

longwave UV light. This fluorescence reaction may not help in identification of Hackmanite, as this reaction is often seen in other similar looking gems too, such as, scapolite, afghanite and tugtupite. This UV reaction along with refractive index of ~1.48 and specific gravity in the range 2.14 to 2.40 helps in separation of Hackmanite with other similar-looking gemstones.

Identity can further be established by Raman and infrared spectroscopies. Due to the massive form and presence of different minerals, polished specimens commonly display mottled cloudy appearance. Transparent gems may display crystalline inclusions and liquid fingerprints.



Figure 3: Orange fluorescence is another striking property of Hackmanite. Here, specimens illustrated in figure 1 display strong orange fluorescence under longwave UV light.

OCCURRENCE AND SOURCES

Hackmanite was first discovered in Greenland in 1896 by L.C.Boergstroem and named after the Finnish Geologist Victor Axel Hackman, professor at University of Helsinki and Geologist with Finnish Geological

Survey. Hackmanite though firstly discovered in Greenland, gem quality Hackmanite deposits was first discovered in Quebec, Canada in 1991. Currently, major sources of Hackmanite are Afghanistan and Myanmar (Burma). Norway and Russia are also other deposits. Most of the Hackmanites arriving in Jaipur market are reportedly from Afghanistan deposits.

TREATMENTS

So far, treatments on Hackmanite are not observed, other than standard oiling. However, with the increasing popularity and demand of Hackmanite, it will not be a surprise to encounter resin-filling in future.

HACKMANITE CARE

Hackmanite is relatively a soft stone; hence care must be taken while handling. It can easily be scratched by other materials. When storing Hackmanite – loose or in jewellery, keep it separately away from other gems and jewellery. It is safe to clean Hackmanite with warm soapy water but should be dried immediately with a soft cloth. It should not be exposed to steam or ultrasonic cleaners. Exposure to high heat will result in loss of its desirable tenebrescent effect permanently.

The gem trade is continuously looking for new materials and Hackmanite is yet another mineral which may gain a lot of popularity amongst the consumers, especially for its unique property of 'tenebrescence' or 'reversible photochromism'.

Gem & Jewellery Skill Council of India Nurturing Skill Centres for Industry Development



We spoke to Rajeev Garg, Executive Director & CEO, Gems and Jewellery Skill Council of India (GJSCI) to understand the nitty-gritty behind skill centres and preparation of skilled force for the gems and jewellery industry.

Q1. What according to you are the challenges in creating a skill development centre?

There are multiple challenges faced whilst creating a skill development centre and the key challenges would be viz.

- The need for the industry to be aligned to absorb the candidates being trained;
- Identifying and recruiting good experienced Trainer is another major challenge in our industry;
- Setting up a skill development centre which actually replicates the industry's working environment;
- The funding for both capital and operational expenses.

Q2. Gems and Jewellery is becoming an organised sector gradually. How do you foresee the times ahead?

Any Industry goes through the same evolution curve, the gems and jewellery industry becoming a more organized sector augurs well for the industry but our industry would always have a

significant number of small and micro establishments with major constitution for the sector.

Q3. How can proficiency be mastered at skill training level?

The appropriate curriculum, right pedagogy, experienced trainers and a major focus on 'learning by doing' are the key factors through which a profession can be mastered.

Q4. Please draw some light on the standardization of the pedagogy of the skill centres.

As you know, GJSCI under the aegis of NSDC has a very standard curriculum and pedagogy which does not change from one skilling centre to the other. We have a more detailed training delivery plan for every skill undertaken for training purposes. Also, we have a standard assessment tool used by a third party Assessment Agency before the candidates are certified. This ensures a highly uniform learning experience across



various skilling centres managed by GJSCI.

Q5. Gems and jewellery sector will directly benefit from these training centres. How is that road map being drawn and what is your expectation?

As you are aware that GJSCI's first Skilling Centre – Jewellery Occupation Skilling Hub

(JOSH) was inaugurated in SEEPZ on 3rd May, 2022 and the first batch of Trainees (Filing & Assembly, Polishing & Cleaning & Metal setting) would be passing out soon, in the first week of August, 2022.

Gems & Jewellery sector is cluster based and similar skilling centres if they come up in major clusters will be beneficial for the industry at large.

Mumbai skilling centre has been established through CSR contribution of the Industry Members operating out of SEEPZ Mumbai. Industries in different clusters should come forward to contribute. GJSCI can help set up similar skilling centres in different places as per the need of Industries. 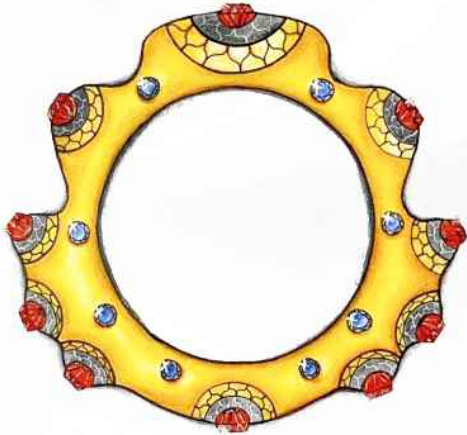

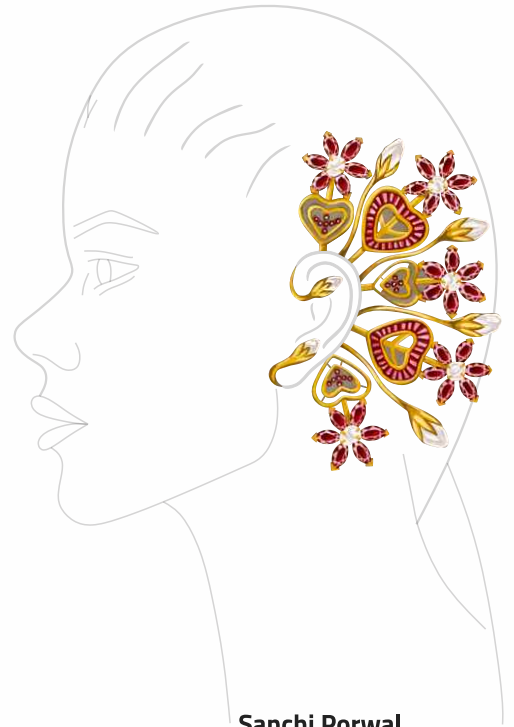

TAXPAYERS CAN NOW CLAIM TAX CREDIT BEFORE 2017

In the year 2017, when GST was implemented, the businessmen had already paid excise and VAT on inventory kept with them. But that input was not accommodated in GST. In such cases, there has been a huge relief granted by the Supreme Court of India to such businessmen. The Hon'ble court has permitted the taxpayers to file for pending GST credit.

The Court has directed GST officers to open a special 60-day window on GSTN portal from 1 September to 30 October for the same. The GST network has also been directed to ensure that there are no problems during this 60-day window. A large number of taxpayers can benefit with this irrespective of them filing for claims or not. The officials have been given a 90-day period to disburse the credit. Taxpayers will also be given a hearing, if need be.



MEMBERS HALL NOW OPEN FOR MEMBERS OF JA

The Jewellers Association Jaipur opened the Members Hall in Johari Bazar for its lifetime members for their meetings and interactions under specified guidelines. 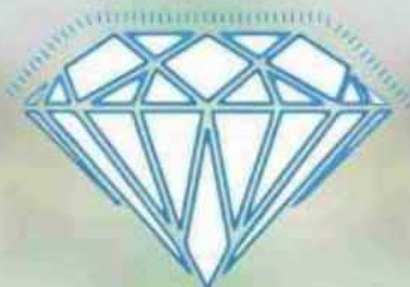

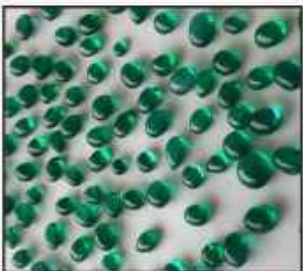
